

Association. The 30th Annual General Meeting was held on December 21st 2002. This report covers the period from January 2003, as upto Dec 2002 was covered by 30th Annual Report. During the year under revive many representations have been made to the Central as well as State Government.

STEEL SCENERIO

with Indian Economy recovering fast and early reports of second quarter results pointing to a buoyant economy, the prospectus fo Steel Industry to operate in a comfortably growth-augmenting scenerio have strengthened, with six months of the current fiscal already elapsed the optimism is still in the air as far as the domestic steel industry is concerned. The current scenerio shows that the domestic steel production is on the rise, consumption is picking up with gradual and sustained recovery of the Indian economy, imports are modest, exports are performing briskly and prices have also stabilised. Further consolidation of the Financial bottomlines is expected in tune with quarter 1 2003 results observe earlier when the quarter 2 2003 and H 1, 2003 results are released by the steel producers. In the meantime the Exports led recovery of the domestic steel industry continues unabated. The rising cost of raw materials and increasing instances of trade barriers in one form or other, are becoming areas of concern.

The Chinese factor continued its magic spell though the impact is being felt in other areas as well. Chinas soaring demand for steel making raw materials has powered bulk rates upto record high levels in the last few months.

EXCISE & CUSTOMS

We have to abide by the rules and regulations of Excise Act, though the Government is seen to simplify the producers but the corruption is coming in the way. However, if the weathers have any problems or grievances in Excise matters, they are requested to bring same to our Notice as our representative is representing the Association to solve and problems of Members clearified. Not only in Excise matters this request applied on all the problems and matters concerning with the Government Departments.

FINANCIAL POSITION

By sincere efforts of the Board of Directors and very positive response from the Members, I am happy to mention here that the financial position of the Association is improving, however still the Members outside Mumbai are not taking care to pay their subscription on time. I request them all to be particular in payment to the Association, after all it is your own Institution.

June 2, 2003.

A delegation comprising of President, Vice-president, Hon. Gen. Secretary and Secretary met the Commissioner of Income Tax Shri. K. L. Tilakchand to apprise them with the difficulties faced by the Members after the implementation of Amended Section 206-C of Income Tax Act.

June 4, 2003.

A letter was addressed to Shri. Swatantra Kumar, Commissioner of Income Tax-30, seeking urgent appointment to discuss the problems related to 10 % TCS on Scrap from 1st June 2003.

June 5, 2003.

A delegation headed by Shri. Kamal Kishore Gupta, Hon. Gen. Secretary met Shri. Swatantra Kumar, Commissioner of Income Tax at Aaykar Bhavan, Churchgate Mumbai to discuss the problems faced by the Steel Rerolling Industry after the implementation of Section 206-C on Scrap.
